What are the aims of this policy?

- To ensure a consistent approach to Home Learning throughout the school.
- To ensure that teachers, parents and children have a clear understanding regarding expectations for Home Learning.
- To ensure that teachers, parents and children are fully aware of the role they play with regard to Home Learning.

What is the purpose of Home Learning?

To raise standards through:

- Consolidating, reinforcing and extending skills and understanding.
- Providing opportunities for parents and children to work together.
- Allowing parents to gain an understanding of what children are learning in school.
- Allowing children to progress towards becoming more independent learners.

How much time should be spent on Home Learning?

	Approx 10 minutes per day (depending upon the child's level) on Reading/Phonics
Reception	5-10 minute weekly tasks for Maths
	Half Termly Learning Quest project (approx. 15 minutes per week or can be grouped)
	10-15 minutes daily reading
Year 1 and 2	2 x 10 minutes spellings per week
	2 x 10 minutes times tables per week
	Half Termly Learning Quest project (approx. 20 minutes per week or can be grouped)
	5 x 15 minutes reading per week
Year 3 and 4	2 x 10 minutes spellings per week
	2 x 15 minute times tables per week
	Half Termly Learning Quest project (approx. 25 minutes per week or can be grouped)
	5 x 20 – 30 minutes reading per week
Year 5 and 6	2 x 10 minutes spellings per week
	1 x 20 minute weekly task in grammar

1 x 20 minute weekly task in maths
Half Termly Learning Quest project (approx. 30 minutes per week can be grouped)

Expectations for Reading Home Learning

- Child's reading book to be changed at least once a week unless it is not appropriate due to it being a longer text
- Each child to have a Reading Record which is signed by an adult in class once a week
- Parents are also expected to sign the reading record once a week

Expectations for Spellings Home Learning

- Children will receive a list of weekly spellings
- These will be tested weekly in class

Expectations for Times Tables Home Learning

- · Children will receive times tables to be learnt at home each week
- These will be tested weekly in class

Expectations for Grammar Home Learning in Years 5 and 6

• Children will be expected to complete independent work based on grammar each week.

Expectations for Maths Home Learning in Years 5 and 6

Children will be expected to complete independent work based on maths each week.

Expectations for Learning Quest

- Children should choose four out of the eight options given to complete their learning quest project
- Work should be presented in their Home Learning Scrapbook or may be separate e.g. artwork, powerpoint
- This Home learning will be expected to be handed in twice during the half term
- During the first hand in children have the opportunity to gain verbal feedback on their project and a comment will be given in their reading record by their teacher about the progress
- During the final hand in for the project the children are expected to present their home learning projects to the rest of the class.
- The final hand in for the half termly project will be given written feedback by the teacher.

Home learning for <u>reading</u>, <u>times tables or maths</u>, <u>spellings and grammar</u> will be given out on a Thursday and tests will take place the following week. Year Five and Six are expected to complete grammar and maths tasks by the following Tuesday.

Home Learning for the <u>Learning Quest</u> will be given out on the last week of the previous term. A text message will be sent to parents reminding them of the two hand in dates for their child's learning quest project.
